Everett Bishop, CWO 3, 85, went home to be with the Lord on November 1, 2021 after a long battle with cancer. He died in his home surrounded by his daughter, Lisa, and his wife, Anna Mae. He was preceded in death by his parents, William E. and Ida J. Bishop, brother, Roy Albert, and sisters, Freda (Tom) Gilmore and Carol (Dewey) Brown. He is survived by his wife, Anna Mae, and his sister, Millie Bishop (Lukich) Stewart and husband Marvin Stewart of Florida, children Debbi (Kevin) Kincaid, of Idaho, Nita B. Solis of Florida, Lisa Bishop Baillio of Virginia, and Michael W.R. Bishop (Debby) of Virginia. He is also survived by four step-sons, Kyle, Kevin, Kirk and Keith. He also had nine grandchildren and 18 great-grandchildren, as well as several nieces and nephews.

Everett served his country in the US Army for 21 years which included two tours during the Vietnam War. He retired GS-12 from a Civil Service position at the Space Center in Huntsville, Alabama. He was a member of the Masons, the Shriners, and many other organizations. He spent his retirement traveling with his wife, Anna Mae, and catching up with family and friends.

There will be a military service held at 1:30pm on November 18th at Osceola Memorial Gardens and a Christian service led by Jim Book, minister of Main Street Christian Church, of Kissimmee, Florida, where Everett was a member for many years.
