Nadia Nasser Aboulhosn, from Kissimmee, Florida passed away, on April 13, 2021 of natural causes. Nadia was born in Btekhmay, Lebanon on February 20th, 1931 to Hafitha Ackley. Her father Kassem, passed away prior to her birth. She was preceded in death by her husband of 68 years, Jamil Hassen Nasser Aboulhosn, her first born son, Roger Nasser Aboulhosn, her sisters Amira Hibbets and Nohad Aboulhosn, and a grandson, David Matthew Hassen. Nadia had a full life and always wanted a houseful of children. Nadia's passion was to cook and take care of her family and others. She enjoyed entertaining and visiting other Aboulhosn relatives, as well as entertaining her children's friends. In her days of Princeton, it was nothing for her to cook for 50-60 people without thinking twice. She loved Lebanon, and her village of Btekhmay. Nothing made her happier than to sit out on the veranda and wave to the walkers. Her last trip was 6 years ago. The family will be having a celebration of her life, on Saturday, April 17th, at 2:30pm at Osceola Memory Gardens, 1717 Old Boggy Creek Rd., Kissimmee, Florida. A graveside service will be directly after.
